Secondary Requirements for Bilingual Mention

The Saskatchewan Ministry of Education requires a minimum of 24 credits for graduation, at least 5 of which will be 30 level credits. Credit counts begin at the grade 10 level. A minimum of 12 courses must be taken in French for Bilingual Mention and 14 courses must be taken in French to receive Honours standing. All courses offered in French are listed in **bold**.

Compulsory courses at Campbell are:

Grade 10 · Français immersion 10, English Language Arts B10, one 10 level Mathématiques, Histoire 10 and Sciences 10.

Grade 11 · Français immersion 20, Français immersion intégré 20, English 20, one 20 level Mathématiques, one 20 or 30 level Science and one 20 or 30 level Social Science.

Grade 12 · Français immersion 30, Sciences sociales 30 and English A30 or English B30 (both are recommended due to many university admission requirements)

The Saskatchewan Ministry of Education also requires students to acquire:

- at least two (2) credits from the Arts Education / Practical & Applied Arts areas at the 10, 20, or 30 level.
- a Mieux-être or Physical Education credit at the 10, 20, or 30 level is required. Mieux-être 10 is the recommended credit.
