CAMPBELL COLLEGIATE ATHLETIC AWARDS CRITERIA AND DESCRIPTIONS 2023

Grade 12s

1. Leadership in Athletics Awards (male and female)

Criteria: Team Leadership, commitment, and dedication, coachability, athletic ability, breadth of participation and school citizenship (see "rating scale" on p. 3)

- a) Must have participated on a number of school sport teams through his/her high school career; OR it could be just one team, but it MUST have been for all four years, and...
- b) Must have an academic average of at least 75% based on honor roll requirements, and ...
- c) Must have displayed leadership ability, sportsmanship and made a significant contribution to the high school athletic program at Campbell Collegiate, and ...
- d) Displayed an appreciation and respect for athletics, and ...
- e) Must be exceptional citizens within the school in the areas of attendance, dedication, and attitude

Award will be presented at the athletic awards night

2. <u>Grade 12 Recognition of Athletic Accomplishment</u> --presented to grade 12 students who meet the following criteria

- a) Must have participated in at least one school sport for all four years at Campbell Collegiate, or...
- b) Demonstrated skill and commitment in a variety of school sports while at Campbell and especially in their grade 12 year
- c) Must have been awarded with a team/sport award during their high school career, and...

- d) Must have displayed an understanding of sportsmanship, character and appreciation of Tartan athletics, and...
- e) Must maintain an average of at least 70% based on the Campbell honor roll requirements, and...
- f) Must be positive role models and citizens within the school and community

Grade 9 – 11 Awards

1. <u>Athletic Engagement and Proficiency Award</u>. Presented to any student in grade 9 who meet the following criteria:

- a) Must have participated in at least two teams/sports during the current school year—ideally one being a "major" sport or at least 3+ "minor" activities, and...
- b) Demonstrated skill and proficiency in a Tartan team/sport, and...
- c) Do not have to win a team award, but it would be a plus, and...
- d) Must maintain an average of at least 70% based on the Campbell honor roll requirements, and...
- e) Must be good role models and citizens within the school and community

2. <u>Athletic Proficiency Award</u>. Presented to any grade 10 or 11 students who meet the following criteria:

- a. Must have participated in at least two teams/sports during the current school year—ideally one being a "major" sport or at least 3+ "minor" activities, and...
- b. Demonstrated skill and proficiency in a Tartan team/sport, and...
- c. Must have been awarded a team award at some point in their Campbell athletic career, and...
- d. Must maintain an average of at least 70% based on the Campbell honor roll requirements, and...
- e. Must be good role models and citizens within the school and community

Team of the Year

• Each year one team is selected to be recognized as the "Team of the Year". This is a difficult comparison certainly—as there is a little bit of comparing apples to oranges—but it is worth it to recognize the great achievement of one team above others. Sometimes tough decisions are worth making.

Criteria:

- Team must have won something ... something truly significant and difficult to win. The more prestigious the better. Could even factor in how long it has been since Campbell has won that in the past (if ever).
- Team should consist of good citizens, good students, and good people. Their own coach should be strenuously advocating for them...if not, then maybe they are not that worthy.
 - Certainly, no discipline problems (on the whole...maybe the odd individual problem can be overlooked, but should be pretty good).
- While it is difficult to weigh the achievements from one sport to another, all deserving candidates nominated will be discussed and voted upon by coaches.
- Non-sanctioned RHSAA sports are eligible to win, but depending on the nominees, said sports may be appreciated differently by the voting coaches.

Coach / Coaching Staff of the Year Award

Awarded annually to one coach / coaching staff who exemplifies many if not all the following criteria (as selected by the Athletic Director):

- Team experienced "success" does not have to be a championship necessarily, but a successful experience for students with 'education through sport' as a key value
- Exemplifies good sportsmanship
- Manages student athletes and promotes personal social growth as well as establishing academic expectations
- Promotes building leadership and citizenship skills
- Exemplifies and promotes our 5 Cs
