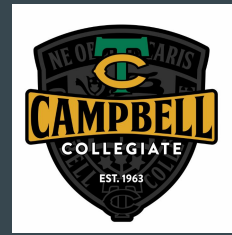

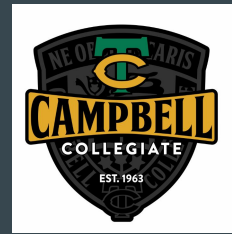




Registration Timelines

From March 8th until March 19th:

- Review registration form with parent(s)/guardian(s) and make choices for courses
 - ★ Consult with CAP and/or subject teachers for course advice and graduation requirements
 - ★ Reference the Course Catalogue
 - ★ Investigate post-secondary requirements (Guidance can help with this!)
- Your CAP teacher will submit your completed registration form by **March 19th.**
- You will submit your signed demographic form to the office by **March 19th.**



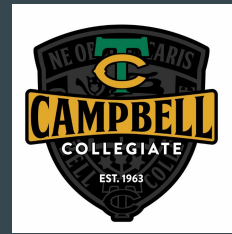
Reminders:

1. The registration form is a request for classes only. Classes will be offered based solely on number of requests. Accordingly, not all classes will run and space for changes will be limited. Please choose wisely, take your time, and get feedback.
2. Courses are designed at grade levels purposefully. Students are to register for classes at their designated grade.
3. Students who choose enriched and AP classes should commit to the program for the duration of the year.

Reminder: French Immersion students require 12 classes in French to receive bilingual mention.

Advanced Placement

If you did not enrol in Enriched programming this year, you still have the opportunity to choose it for grade ten.
