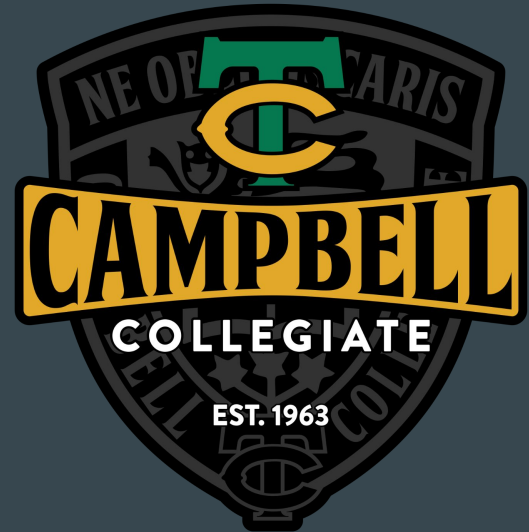

March 15 → receive course request form in CAP

March 15-26

- review course request form with family
- consult with CAP teacher and/or subject teachers for course advice and graduation requirements
- reference the course catalogue on the website
- investigate post-secondary requirements (guidance can help with this)

March 27 → confirm your course selections during 3-way conferences

March 28 → CAP teachers submit class sets of request forms

1. The course request form is a request for classes only. Classes will be offered based solely on number of requests. Accordingly, not all classes will run and space for changes will be limited.

3. Students who choose enriched and AP classes should commit to the program for the duration of the year.

Law 30

Prerequisites: Any Social Science 10

Law 30 is an introduction to Canadian law with a focus on how laws are made in Canada and enforced, the role of the judicial system in Canada, and how police investigate a crime.

If you have aspirations of a career in law or law enforcement, this class is for you!



Psychology 30

Prerequisites: None required, Psych 20 is helpful

AP Psychology

Prerequisite: a Social Science 10

- You're good with **time management and memorization**



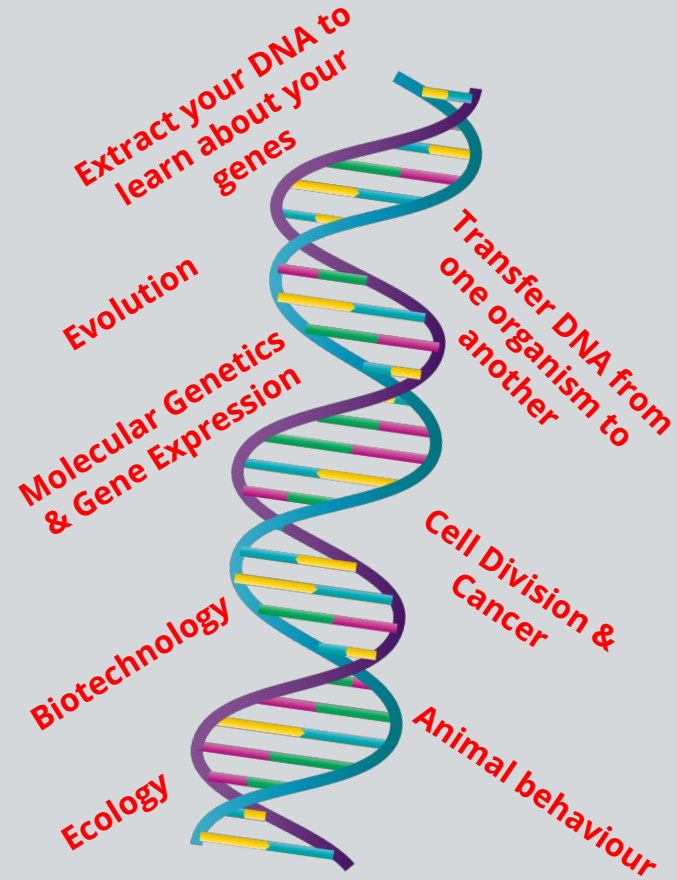
AP Biology 30

Prerequisite: Health Science 20 (Enriched preferred)

Part of a three course route (**Enriched HS20 + AP Biology 30 & AP Biology Prep 30L**) finishing in second semester grade 12 with the AP Exam (May)

Take if:

- You're interested in strengthening your practical science skills
- Learning how living things work sounds exciting to you
- You are willing to work hard and LEARN

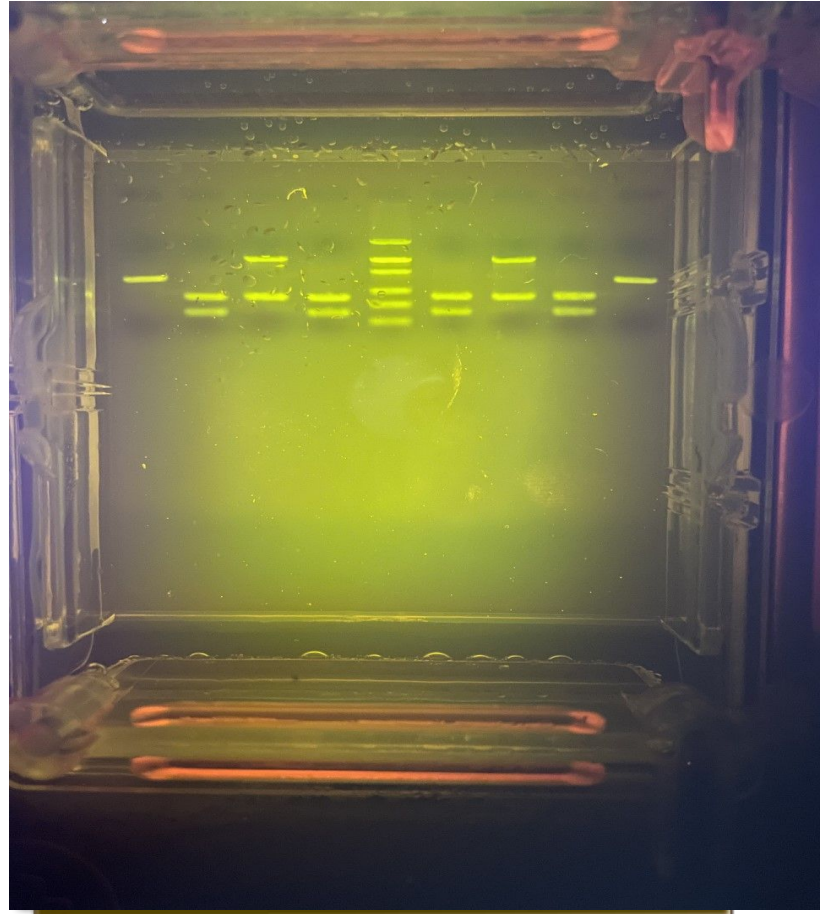


Forensic Science 30L

Prerequisites: Science 10 and a Social Science 10

Much like Law 30, Forensic Science 30L looks at the foundation of Canadian law, with an emphasis on how science and law collaborate to solve crime.

Areas of study include fingerprint and DNA analysis, crime scene investigation, plus many more fields of study.



Humanities 30

In this interdisciplinary course at Campbell Collegiate, students will examine Canada's history in an effort to understand contemporary challenges while also writing, reading, listening, speaking, and creating to meet English Language Art A30 outcomes.

By combining ELA A30 and History 30, students will have the opportunity to reduce redundancy between the two courses to offer a more in depth look at the history context of Canadian literature.



French 30

Prerequisites: French 20, French 10

Students will be expected to create small skits, vlogs, audio recordings of basic conversation, and read small excerpts entirely in French. Mini-units include the creation of a superhero, starting a small business, and French culture. We will watch French movies/TV shows and analyze them. Our final project is the creation of our own film. In groups students will create a 5-10 minute film to present to the class. The film will be accompanied by a script, storyboard, trailer and more.



Spanish 30

Prerequisites: Spanish 20

Students at this level will continue to build on vocabulary and other skills learned in Spanish 20. While students work through a variety of themes, they will be developing a higher level of speaking, listening, reading and writing skills. The Spanish language will be practiced through interactive activities and presentations.



Band 30

Prerequisites: Band 20

Students will continue to build upon their development as musicians. Band is a performance-based class where we work towards a common goal of making incredible music. Concerts, festivals, and music tours are our outlets to share our talents and hard work.



Choral 30

Prerequisites: Choral 20 recommended

Performance-based class that continue to build upon group singing and musicianship skills. You will be presented with many opportunities to enhance your abilities such as concerts, festivals and travel!

Vocal Jazz 30

Co-requisite: Choral 30

Vocal Jazz provides you the opportunity to participate in high quality, high-energy performing ensemble! You will be present the opportunity to showcase your talent in concerts, festivals and travel! This ensemble performs a variety of styles of music while developing your mic technique!



Drama 30

Prerequisites: Drama 20 recommended

Drama places emphasis on experiential learning and exploring the elements of drama, examining both performing and technical theatre.

Take if:

- You like being creative and expressing ideas
- Group based activities sounds exciting to you
- You are a risk taker



Musical Theatre 30

Prerequisites: None

Achieve two credits (**Arts Ed 30+ Theatre Arts 30**)

Take if:

- You want to be part of a full scale Broadway production
- You want to develop your skills as a vocalist, dancer and actor
- Being part of a community sounds inviting to you
- You love applause



Guitar 30

This is an intermediate to advanced course that will allow you to 'pick' up where you left off in Guitar 20. It's an opportunity to further challenge and improve your guitar-playing and your knowledge of practical music theory.

Here, you will have numerous opportunities to pursue your own musical interests and goals independently, while also getting the chance to experiment with diverse styles such as jazz, classical, and flamenco, at a higher skill-level than is required for Guitar 20.

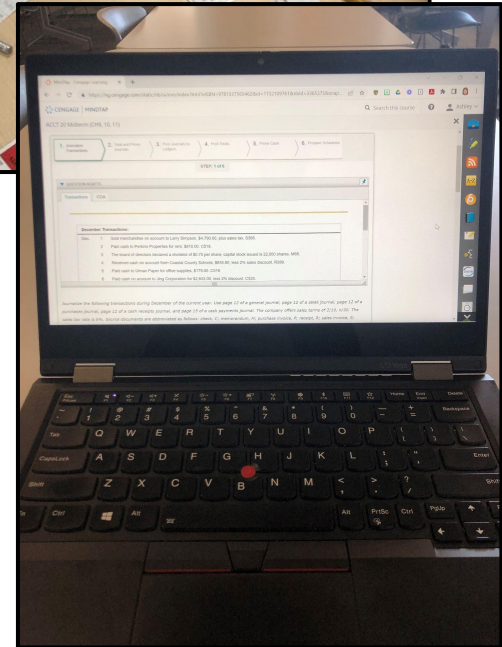
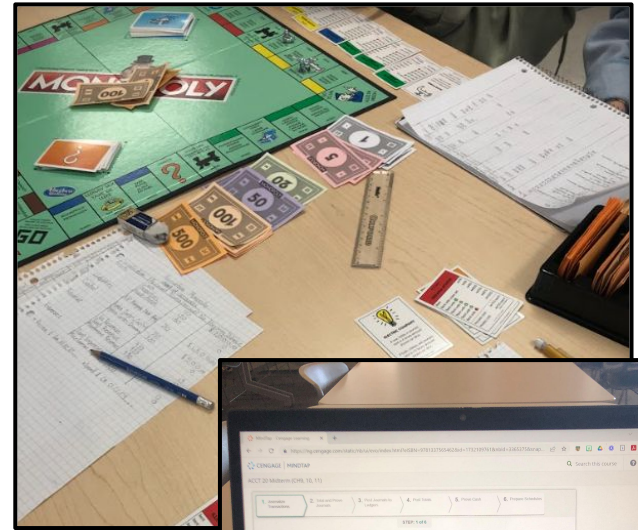
Accounting 30

Students in this class will continue building on previous knowledge by independently building more challenging woodworking projects.

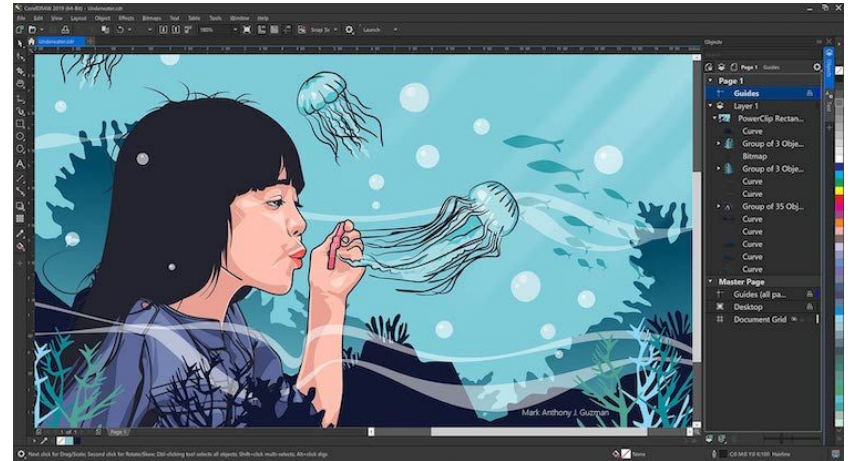


Graphic Arts 30

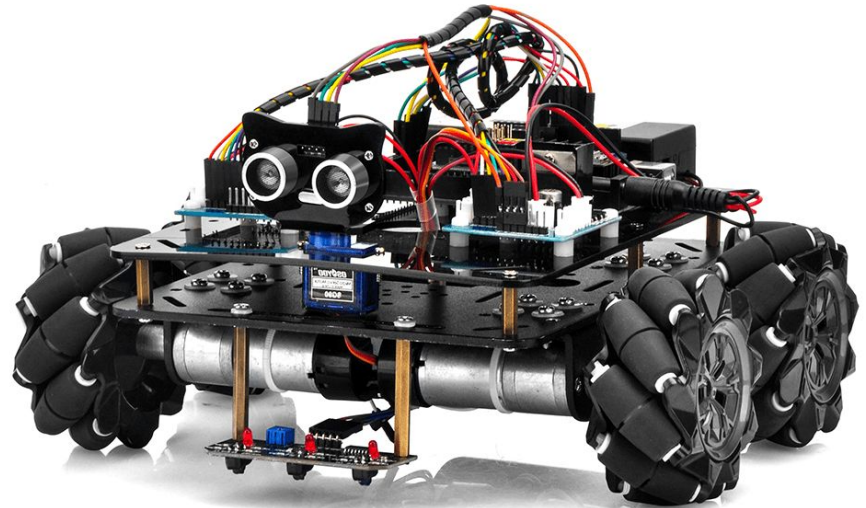

Yearbook (Photography 30)

*Prerequisites: Yearbook (Photography 20)

(It is expected that students will take pictures of school-related activities that fall outside of 8:00 am - 3:30 pm. With the additional time students put in, they will earn classes off.)

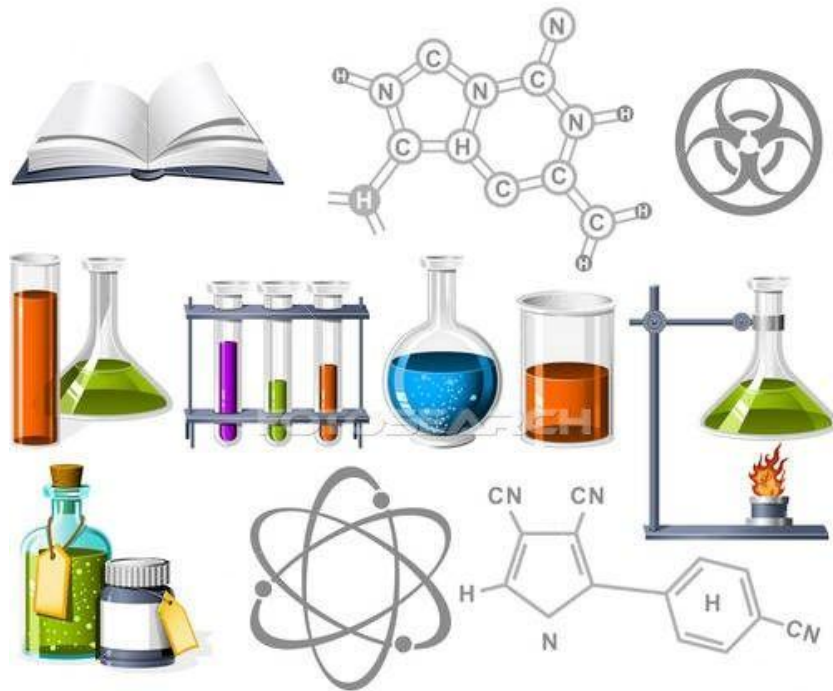


Chemistry 30

Prerequisites: Science 10, Physical Science 20

Recommended math stream: Foundations 20 and/or Precalculus 20

*The role of electrons in chemical bonding, describing equilibrium systems and the principles of electrochemistry are explored



Physical Education 30

Prerequisites: Phys Ed 20

This program includes some new activities plus some activity repetition from the Physical Education 20 course. Students will be directed toward a higher level of skill acquisition and knowledge with the activities being covered. Students will focus on their own personal fitness development by developing a high understanding of the Health-Related Fitness Components. Fitness assessment will be done throughout the semester, so students can monitor their progress.

Activities may include: Golf, Tennis, Curling, Ten Pin Bowling, Boxing, Billiards, Squash, Scuba Diving, Level 10, Spin Class, Group Kick Class, Wallyball, Water Polo, Gymnastics, Tchoukball, Volleyball, Basketball, Badminton, Football, Soccer. A downhill ski/snowboard trip with other credit physical education classes may be available. This will be an extra cost and will be optional.



Outdoor Pursuits 30

Wellness 10 or Phys ed 20

This Phys Ed course is designed to allow students to explore the outside world and develop life skills in alternative environments.

Personal Fitness 30L

Prerequisites:
Wellness 10

Students who have a specific interest in physical fitness will find this class beneficial. Students will be learning both theory and practical knowledge in the class. The course focuses on training for personal fitness goals. Students will gain a deeper understanding of nutrition, anatomy, physiology, training principles, personal assessment, and reflection of your level of health related components of fitness, learning about the skill related components of fitness, goal setting and working towards achieving personal goals. Any students interested in entering the Faculty of Kinesiology should consider taking this course.
