PROCEDURES FOR CAP & GOWN

- Each student will be assigned **FOUR** tickets - general seating. Students are to pick up their tickets from Ms. Egeto in the library between June 9th to June 12th from 12:00 to 1:00. Graduates do **NOT** require a ticket.
- Any additional tickets will become available first come, first serve at the office starting at 8:30 am on June 23th. They will be available in quantities of 2. Please note, we were unable to meet the ticket demand last year. Therefore, please plan accordingly and limit your group size. Any questions in regards to tickets, please contact Megan Egeto (megan.egeto@rbe.sk.ca)
- The main doors to the Conexus open 30 minutes before the ceremony.
- **If you or your guests require accessible seating please notify Tabitha Booth before June 16th.** You will need to arrive early and speak with a Conexus staff member, who will assist.
- There is no reserved seating.
- The ceremony will begin promptly at 1:00 p.m.
- There will be an on-site photographer who will take pictures of the ceremony. Therefore, we ask that photography during the ceremony be left to the photographer. A link to the photographs will be available on the Campbell Collegiate webpage after the ceremony. Photos will be available for download for **48 hours** after the ceremony. The link will then be removed from the website.

Student Information
PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION CAREFULLY.

1. **PICK UP YOUR GOWN** on June 22nd at 1:00pm in the Library. Please note, **ALL** student fees must be paid and **ALL** library materials returned to receive a gown. Only in emergent situations will the gowns be given at a different time. Please speak with your CAP teacher if accommodations must be made.
2. Arrive at the Conexus Arts Center **by 12:30 p.m. BRING YOUR CAP and GOWN.**
3. Use the **Southwest Entrance** and go directly to the Shumiatcher Room. Please do not bring any valuables with you as the Shumiatcher Room will not be locked during the ceremony.
4. This is a formal occasion. Please dress in business casual. (Please consider what you look like with a gown over your clothes. Will you look classy or not? consider not wearing shorts, white gym socks, sandals or sneakers.)
 - Wear the cap with the **tassel on the right side**. If necessary, use bobby pins to hold the cap in place. Please supply your own pins.
5. Once you have put on your gown and cap, **line up alphabetically** in the area designated for your CAP.
6. If you are to receive an award, your CAP teacher will notify you that you are to receive an award, but not which award.
7. Promptly at 12:50 p.m., you will be escorted to the auditorium. You will line up by CAP beginning with 12A. Your homeroom teacher will lead your CAP. Walk **quietly** to your seats on stage.
8. **Presentation of Diplomas:** CAP's will return to the basement and be brought up to stage right in order of CAP. After you receive your diploma you will head back to the basement. It is crucial to be quiet: the audience can hear you. You will hear your name when it is your turn to receive your diploma from Mr. Girodat.
 - **Mr. Girodat** will hand you your diploma and pose for a photo. You will continue across the stage, and your CAP teacher will move your tassel from left to right, and a picture taken. (Remember: receive with the left hand and shake with the right.)
9. The curtain will open, and you will be asked to stand and be presented as "Campbell Collegiate's 2025/2026 Graduating Class" to the audience.

Valedictory Address

We will be choosing both a French and English valedictorian to represent our bilingual school. There will be one speech written by both the English and the French valedictorians together. The French valedictorian will be required to do their part of the speech in French (both spoken and written).

Requirements for Valedictorian:

Any student interested in applying for Valedictorian will have to complete the [application](#). As well as submit a [nomination form](#) available from Mrs. Cherepuschak (rm. 225) or Mme. Therrien (rm. 114) starting Monday April 13, 2026.

- **COMPETENCY:** Overall average of 85% and in good academic standing (For example, no previous suspensions.) for the following classes:
 - ELA 30A & ELA 30B (unless FI = ELA 30 & FI30)
 - Social 30 (SS 30 or History 30 or Sciences Sociales 30)
 - Math 20/30
 - Science 20/30
 - Highest 30 Level Elective
- **CHARACTER, COURTESY & COMPETENCY:** Students are considered to be a leader and positive role model within the building by staff and students. In order to demonstrate, students who are applying will need to complete a [reference form](#) that contains a reference from:
 - Academic teacher they have taken a class from.
 - Teacher/staff who have worked with you outside of the classroom and can vouch for your character.
 - Four student references
- **CHARACTER:** In 250-500 words, please provide a short description as to why you would be a great candidate for the 2026 Valedictorian. Please make mention of your contributions to leadership and role model amidst your class of 2026.
- **COMMITMENT, COMPETENCE, & CHARACTER:** - List extracurricular involvement & school programs that you are involved in within Campbell Collegiate.
- Timeline of the Valedictorian selection process:
 - [Application](#) & Nominations are due **May 4th, 2026**. See **Mrs. Cherepuschak (rm. 225) or Mme. Therrien (rm. 114) for nomination forms**
 - The Valedictorian Committee will shortlist and contact nominees for **May 19th**.
 - Valedictorian nomination speeches presented in the auditorium on **Monday, May 25th (French speeches) and Tuesday, May 26th (English speech)** during CAP.
 - Grade 12 CAP classes will vote on **Wednesday May 27th**.
 - The valedictorians will be announced on **Friday May 29th**.
